Science of the Seasons: Phenology Project Training

Stewardship


Saturdays, November thru March, times and dates TBA Wednesdays, April thru October, starting at 5:30pm**

Earth Day Fort Wayne

Sunday, April 28 from 9am to 7:30pm (event is from 1pm to 5pm)

This event will be very similar to previous year's events with education stations, a farmer's market, a tent featuring our partners in conservation, a native planting, presentations and the bird viewing station. We will need help during set up, parking, education stations, sharing information, clean up, and more!

Invasive Plant Species Training

Part 1, Wednesday, June 12, at 6pm at LRWP Office

In this indoor training, you will learn to identify invasive plant species known to be on our properties and where the infestations are. If you miss Freya, here's your chance to see her again, she will be running these trainings! RSVP with Maraiah.

Part 2, Saturday, June 15, from 10am to noon at the Eagle Marsh barn

This field training will build on what was learned in Part 1 by examining first-hand the invasive species we encounter at Eagle Marsh. This training will sharpen our abilities to identify species in the field and differentiate them from possible look-a-likes.

Monarch Monitor Training

Saturday, June 22, from 10am to Noon

Join a team of monitors that check weekly for monarch adults, caterpillars, and eggs at Eagle Marsh and our Arrowhead Preserves. This is part of the citizen science Monarch Larva Monitoring Program through the University of Minnesota. This training will go over how to identify different monarch life stages, how to monitor, and pick the trail you would like to monitor. Weekly monitoring occurs between July and September and substitute monitors are available to help during vacations, etc. If you are a trained monitor, please let us know if you would like to continue monitoring this season. There will be an online sign-up made for Monarch Fest closer to the event. Last year's event had over 2000 visitors and the event is growing – so we may see a bigger turn out if the weather is right!
